

Missouri Department of Labor - Age and Other Discrimination



The Missouri Human Rights Act prohibits discrimination in housing, employment, and places of public accommodations based on **race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, disability, age** (in employment only), and **familial status** (in housing only). The Act also makes it unlawful to retaliate against an individual for filing a complaint of discrimination, testifying or assisting in an investigation, or proceeding under the Act. Additionally, the Act protects individuals against discrimination on the basis of their association with a person in a protected category. Individuals who believe they have been discriminated against for any of those reasons can **file a complaint** with the Missouri Commission on Human Rights (MCHR). View the **complaint process**.
