

EDUCATION RIGHTS FOR HOMELESS STUDENTS

COVID-19 Updates: April 23, 2020

Are you a student experiencing homelessness? You have rights!

During school closure for COVID-19, you have the right to distance or online learning. You have the right to get the services, resources, and support from your school.

Who is a homeless student?

The law says "homeless" students are those who don't have "a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence." This includes you and your family doubling up with other family members or friends due to loss of housing, financial hardship, or living in a motel/hotel, staying in a shelter or in a car.

Where can homeless students go to school?

Where you go to school depends on what is in your <u>best interest</u>. If you move to a new temporary place in a different school district, you can <u>stay enrolled</u> in the school you went to before you moved unless you or your parents don't want that.

What should a school do for a homeless student?

- The school should enroll you immediately. Ask for the Homeless Liaison at the school.
- The school should let you <u>attend classes</u>, including online classes.
- The school should give you meals, social work services, and other resources.
- The school must give you equal access to the same services other students have.

What if the school makes a decision that you or your family does not agree with?

If a school makes an enrollment decision that you do not feel is in your <u>best interest</u>, you have the right to begin the <u>dispute resolution process</u>. First, the school should tell you in writing their decision. You can appeal if you disagree. You may want to call Legal Services of Eastern Missouri for help if this happens. While the school reconsiders, you should be allowed to enroll and attend classes.

What about getting free meals?

Who should help?
